

FLAGLER QUILTS BOARD.

Resigns in Millbrook When Voters Oppose School Improvements.

POUGHKEEPSIE, N. Y., Nov. 10.—J. Harkness Flagler of New York, who has a country home at Millbrook, Dutchess County, has resigned as a member of the Millbrook Board of Education. It is said Mr. Flagler gave as the reason for his resignation the penuriousness of the taxpayers of the village in voting against a proposal to obtain \$15,000 to alter and enlarge the Millbrook High School.

In a letter to the Board of Education Mr. Flagler explained that he sent in his resignation because his business required much of his time in New York. Friends of Mr. Flagler who knew of his activity in trying to stir up public sentiment in favor of spending a little money in improving the school building and of his disappointment when the taxpayers voted the proposal down, say that he has quit because he was displeased with the action of the villagers. Mr. Flagler had been a member of the board for several years.
